## Another Outstanding Member joins us! Inducting Rick Herring Director - Augusta Urban Ministries



The history of Augusta Urban Ministries (AUM) is a story of dedication to the less fortunate of Augusta. Inner city Methodist churches established AUM in 1967 to meet the growing and changing needs of the urban area. We provide critical daily living needs for homeless and low income people through unique programs.

Through the years AUM has grown both in size and number of programs offered to the community. In the early 1980's, in response to the need for quality early childhood education for low income families, a sliding fee scale preschool was established for two of Augusta 's low-income communities. Over time this program has evolved into Preschool Plus. In 1987, AUM and the Equal Opportunity Authority of Augusta jointly established the first transitional house for homeless families in Augusta , a program that continues today. In 1995 AUM began and continues to operate the only free Furniture Bank in the CSRA.

Whenever possible, we work collaboratively with other agencies and churches. Through the Furniture Bank we provide furniture, blankets, coats, and bicycles for clients of thirty-six agencies and a number of local churches. We work with a number of social service agencies through our programs for children and youth. We continue to look for partnerships that enhance the services available to people in need in our community.
